Even if your site is not in close proximity to bushland, burning embers from bushfires can travel many kilometers to impact your site. Climate change is also creating conditions for making bushfires more frequent and intense.

What is Bushfire Prone Land?

In NSW, Bushfire Prone Land (BFPL) is land that has been identified as having the potential to support a bushfire and therefore poses a bushfire risk to development of the land. Bushfire prone land maps are prepared by local council and certified by the NSW Rural Fire Service (RFS), as required under Section 10.3 of *The Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

How does BFPL affect the Development Process?

If your site is on BFPL, a bushfire planning assessment must be undertaken for any development to determine whether it complies with the <u>Planning for Bush Fire Protection (PBP)</u> development standards.

To satisfy the requirements of these standards, a development application must demonstrate that sufficient Bushfire Protection Measures (BPMs) exist to effectively mitigate the threat of a bushfire to people and property. Protection measures that need to be considered include:

- Asset Protection Zones (APZs) around buildings where vegetation is managed to reduce fuel loads and provide a buffer from bushfire attack.
- Building location, design and construction; buildings on BFPL must comply with the National Construction Code and *Australian Standard* 3959: Construction of Buildings in Bushfire-prone Areas, relevant to the bushfire risk level of the site.
- Appropriate and sufficient site access points for emergency services and evacuation of occupants.
- Water availability for firefighting and location of utilities.

How is Bushfire Risk Measured?

To comply with the relevant construction standards, a measure of bushfire risk relating to a site is required. This is known as the Bushfire Attack Level (BAL). The environmental factors used to determine this include:

- · the distance between the building and unmanaged vegetation;
- the potential fuel load; the type of vegetation, its density and flammability
- the slope of the land with respect to the building; a fire travelling uphill will travel faster
- · the fire weather region the site is located in; fires can be more severe in dry, hot and windy conditions

What Bushfire History Data is Included?

This report includes bushfire history data mapped by the NSW RFS between the 2001-2002 and 2019-2020 bushfire seasons, and wildfires mapped to National Parks and surrounds dating back to 1920.


